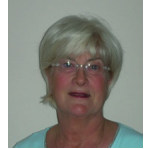

## SAT Results

Once again we were really pleased with our year 6 results at the end of this year.

Copdock - 100% reached the expected standard in reading, writing and maths, with 2 children exceeding these standards to achieve greater depth in these areas too.

Bentley - 100% achieved the expected standard in maths and 75% in reading; again 2 children exceeded across all areas.

All the data will be made available on the school's website later in the year once we've received the national data for comparison. This will also include the KS1 data which was also positive again this year.

Children and staff have all worked really hard to secure these fantastic results whilst continuing to enjoy a creative and enjoyable curriculum in a range of subject areas. We take great pride in preparing all of our children for the next stage of their education ensuring they are confident, successful and responsible when they move on to high school.

Thank you also to parents for continuing to work in partnership with school to achieve the best provision for our children.

The Head Pupils have done a fantastic job this year developing and applying many skills to support school improvement.
