1:15 - Topic (Science, PE, History, Geography, RE, PSHE, Music, Art, DT, French, Forest schools)

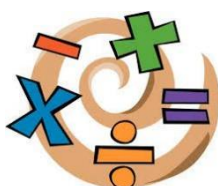
2:45 - Story

Homework

Reading challenge: Read 5x a week for 5-10. Please write these reads in the orange reading log, this will be checked on Friday and those who have completed their five reads will receive a sticker for the chart, which they will collect in order to gain certificates.

Spellings: 10 spellings will be set every week based on our focus in phonics that week. These will also be uploaded to spelling shed which you can use to practise.

Number challenge: Practise for the number challenge. We will test your number bonds/times tables every Friday, based on your current level (We will write the challenge you are currently focusing on in your homework book.)

Topic activities will also be set, these will be short and fun activities that reference the children's learning in class.

Around the time of SAT's there may be additional homework set in order to help them practise and prepare.
